**Part B. CV SUMMARY**

I dedicated the first decade of my academic career (2000–2010) to the political economy of ICT and Spanish media groups. The former allowed me to produce a series of research books including one of my most cited volumes, *El mito digital: discursos hegemónicos sobre Internet y periodismo* (with Jose M. Jarque, Anthropos, 2008). The latter allowed me to introduce the financialisation approach—following the work of critical economists—into the field of political economy of communication and to produce a volume that remains my most cited publication (*Journalism in Crisis: Corporate Media and Financialisation*, Hampton Press, 2010).

Since 2010, I have extended my political economy skills with cultural studies approaches by incorporating discourse analysis into my research, making me one of the few communication scholars to merge these two typically distinct fields of study. In doing so, I also broadened my focus to include a much under-researched topic in critical communication studies: interest groups and influence in relation to discursive coalitions, particularly in the context of the environment and our relationship with non-human animals.

This shift aligned with my long-standing concerns about power relations in society and was guided by a recognition of the need to expand the understanding of discrimination within communication studies in order to engage with key developments in contemporary ethical thought. To this end, I collaborated with colleagues from Europe and the United States to help establish the field of critical animal and media/communication studies (*Almiron, Cole & Freeman, Routledge, 2016*). Since then, my research has increasingly centred on the intersections between communication ethics, interest groups, and strategic communication.

In addition to this work, I have opened a new area of research and reflection focused on the ethics of communication, with a particular emphasis on the ethics of persuasion. This line of inquiry explores the boundaries between legitimate and illegitimate persuasion, aiming to critically examine how strategic communication can uphold or undermine ethical principles, especially in contexts involving vulnerable groups or contentious social issues. In this area, I have edited and written books that add a contribution to ethics to my research on political economy and discourse, including *Especismo y Lenguaje* (edited with Catia Faria, Plaza y Valdés 2024), *Animal Suffering and Public Relations* (Routledge 2024), *'Like and Animal' Critical Animal Studies Approaches to Borders, Displacement, and Othering* (edited with Natalie Khaazal, Brill 2021), *Rethinking Think Tanks Experts vs impostors* (with Jordi Xifra, PUZ 2021) and *Climate Change Denial and Public Relations. Strategic Communication and Interest Groups in Climate Inaction* (edited with Jordi Xifra, Routledge 2020).

I have three six-year research periods (2004-2009, 2010-2015, 2016-2021) and have published more than 120 papers—74 in peer-reviewed journals, including 18 top-tier journals (Q1 & Q2) —authored or co-authored a total of 26 books and edited a further 15 volumes. I have been involved in 11 competitive grant funded research projects (two as PI) and have 2,204 citations in Google Scholar and over 36,000 reads/views of my work in Academia.edu and Researchgate.net. I have presented more than 50 papers at academic conferences of the main national and international communication associations (more than 20 of them at international conferences outside Spain), and I have conducted or been invited to conduct research at universities in France (Université Paris 8), Sweden (Kalmar University, Lund University), the United Kingdom (Manchester University, University of Westminster, London School of Economics and Political Science), the Netherlands (Amsterdam University) and Canada (Simon Fraser University).

I have also supervised seven PhD dissertations, more than 40 final master dissertations and am the founder and coordinator of the MA in International Studies in Media, Power and Difference, an official master's programme established in 2015 at UPF.
